FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

The Phoenix Symphony's highest priority is the health and well-being of all our patrons, musicians, artists, staff and volunteers. In light of the rapidly evolving situation surrounding the COVID -19 Pandemic, with tremendous regret, The Phoenix Symphony will **cancel** the remainder of its 2019/20 Season, all performances through June 6, 2020.

The performances affected by this cancellation are as follows:

- **Disney in Concert – March 13,14 and 15; all four performances at Symphony Hall**
- **Debussy, Ravel and Prokofiev – March 21 and 22 at Symphony Hall**
- **Mendelssohn and Schumann – Saturday March 27 at Scottsdale Center for the Performing Arts**
- **Music of David Bowie – Saturday March 28 at Mesa Amphitheatre**
- **The Beatles' Abby Road – Saturday April 4 at Mesa Amphitheatre**
- **Gershwin's Rhapsody in Blue – May 15, 16 and 17 at Symphony Hall**
- **Beethoven's Symphony No. 8 – May 22, 23 and 24 at Symphony Hall**
- **Cirque Troupe Vertigo – May 29, 30 and 31 at Symphony Hall**
- **Beethoven and Shostakovich – June 5 and 6 at Symphony Hall**

Performance to be postponed to the 20/21 Season:

- **Harry Potter and the Half Blood Prince™ – Friday, Saturday and Sunday, April 17-19 at Symphony Hall.**
